WHO WILL WIN A GEORGE LONDON AWARD IN 2016?
THE 45TH ANNUAL GEORGE LONDON AWARDS COMPETITION FOR SINGERS –
FINAL ROUND AND AWARDS ANNOUNCEMENT IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC
FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2016, AT 4:00 PM
AT THE MORGAN LIBRARY & MUSEUM'S GILDER LEHRMAN HALL

The Panel of Judges Includes Harolyn Blackwell, Alfred F. Hubay, Nora London, George Shirley, Richard Stilwell (One of the First Winners of the George London Award), and Frederica von Stade

On Friday, February 19, 2016, 24 of the best young American and Canadian opera singers will perform with pianist Craig Rutenberg before a panel of judges and an enthusiastic audience at The Morgan Library & Museum, hoping to win a **George London Award**, an honor that has been conferred upon hundreds of the best young singers since 1971.

This will be the final round of the 45<sup>th</sup> annual **George London Foundation Awards Competition**, one of the oldest and most prestigious vocal competitions in the U.S. and Canada. Over three days of preliminary auditions on February 15-17, 90 singers will compete to reach the finals.

At the event, each singer performs one selection, and the winners are announced, all at The Morgan Library & Museum's Gilder Lehrman Hall on **Friday, February 19, at 4:00 PM**. After the finalists' performances, the audience is invited to a reception while the judges deliberate. The audience is then asked back into the hall for the announcement of the winners.

The singers will be competing for five George London Awards of \$10,000 each, and five George London Encouragement Awards of \$1,000 each. In addition, all of the finalists who do not win George London Awards or Encouragement Awards will be given a \$500 Honorable Mention.

This year's panel of judges includes soprano Harolyn Blackwell, former Metropolitan Opera administrator Alfred F. Hubay, George London Foundation President Nora London, tenor and voice professor George Shirley, baritone Richard Stilwell (who won a George London Award at the first competition, in 1971), and mezzo-soprano Frederica von Stade. The competition pianist is renowned collaborative pianist Craig Rutenberg.

The 2015 George London Award winners were soprano Julie Adams, mezzo-sopranos Julia Dawson and Sarah Mesko, tenor Michael Brandenburg, baritone Reginald Smith, Jr., and bass Adam Lau.

Since 1971, the annual competition of The George London Foundation for Singers has been giving its George London Awards, and a total of more than \$2 million, to an outstanding roster of young American and Canadian opera singers who have gone on to international stardom – the list of past winners includes Christine Brewer, Joyce DiDonato, Renée Fleming, Christine Goerke, Catherine Malfitano, James Morris, Matthew Polenzani, Sondra Radvanovsky, Neil Shicoff, and Dawn Upshaw.

One of the oldest vocal competitions in the United States and Canada, the George London Foundation Awards Competition offers among the most substantial awards. As is seldom the case in musical competitions, no fee is charged to the applicants or competitors, a pianist is provided for the competition rounds, and prizes are awarded immediately.

After the competition, the **George London Foundation's 2015-16 season** continues with the celebration of the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the recital series, as well as the final duo recital of the season:

- George London Foundation Celebration Concert: Twenty Years of Recitals In
   Collaboration with the Morgan on Wednesday, April 6, 2016, at 7:00 PM. Renowned
   Canadian tenor Ben Heppner is master of ceremonies for the starry event that features
   eight George London Award winners who are among opera's biggest stars, and one
   recent winner: Ailyn Pérez, soprano; Sondra Radvanovsky, soprano; Christine Brewer,
   soprano; Susanne Mentzer, mezzo-soprano; Matthew Polenzani, tenor; James Morris,
   bass-baritone; Eric Owens, bass-baritone; and Brandon Cedel, bass-baritone. Joining
   the singers on the recital stage will be two of the opera world's finest pianists, Ken Noda
   and Craig Rutenberg. The event also includes a festive post-concert reception.
- **Dimitri Pittas**, tenor, and **Jennifer Johnson Cano**, mezzo-soprano, with Christopher Cano, piano. Dimitri Pittas is a 2004 George London Award winner; Jennifer Johnson Cano won her award in 2014. <u>Sunday, May 15, 2016</u>, at 4:00 PM.

## The Legacy of George London

The goal of the London Foundation, the support and nurturing of young singers, was an abiding interest of the great American bass-baritone George London, who devoted a great part of the time and energy of his later years to this purpose. "Remembering his difficult road to success, George wanted to devise a way to make the road a little easier for future generations of singers," said George London Foundation President Nora London. Initially created under the auspices of the National Opera Institute, the George London Awards program has been administered since 1990 directly by the Foundation as a living legacy to George London's own exceptional talent and generosity.
